

Vermont Human Rights Commission Appoints New Executive Director Big Hartman



Big Hartman joined the Vermont Human Rights Commission in September of 2021. They bring to the Commission eighteen years of experience as an attorney in Vermont. After graduating from Vermont Law School magna cum laude in 2005, Hartman worked at a Stowe law firm representing Workers' Compensation claimants and personal injury plaintiffs. From 2007-2013, Hartman was in-house counsel at the Vermont State Employees' Association, representing the union and its members in cases before the Vermont Labor Relations Board and in Vermont courts. Before joining the HRC, Hartman operated a solo law practice called Welcoming Workplaces that was focused on preventing workplace harassment through workplace trainings and management consultations.

In 2019, Welcoming Workplaces contracted with the Vermont Commission on Women to compile resources VCW's workplace and develop online content for the harassment prevention website (https://workplacesforall.vermont.gov/). Along with their broad experience as an attorney assisting both managers and employees. Hartman brings years of training and knowledge regarding equity and inclusion work. Over the years, Hartman has also served as a Board member for non-profit organizations, including the Vermont Association for Justice, the Washington County Bar Association, Circle of Women International, and the Pride Center of Vermont.
